

Guidelines Regarding National Taiwan Normal University Overseas Chinese Scholarship for “National Taiwan University System International High School Alliance” Member Schools

Approved on November 19, 2023

1. In order to actively recruit top-tier and outstanding students from Southeast Asia, National Taiwan Normal University (hereafter referred to as "the University") has established the Overseas Chinese Scholarship Guidelines (hereafter referred to as "these guidelines") for National Taiwan Normal University “National Taiwan University System (NTUS) International High School Alliance” Member Schools.
2. Qualified Applicants:
Outstanding overseas Chinese students who are recommended by the principals of the "NTUS International High School Alliance" member schools, admitted through NTNU Overseas Chinese Students Application, and who have not yet received any scholarship from a governmental agency (organization) in Taiwan.
3. Scholarship Quota:
 - (1) One overseas Chinese student from each alliance member school, nominated by the principal from the top 5% of the student body.
 - (2) Number determined and allocated by the Office of International Office each year based upon funding for that year.
4. Scholarship Amount:
Monthly stipend of NT\$6,000 along with tuition and miscellaneous fee waivers per semester.
5. Application Process:
 - (1) New student: Following the recommendation by the principal of an alliance member school and securing enrollment qualification by admittance through NTNU Overseas Chinese Students Application, the outstanding overseas Chinese student shall complete registration for the enrolled semester.
 - (2) Renewing student: The Office of International Affairs will conduct a review of the renewing student's qualification.
6. Scholarship and Tuition and Miscellaneous Fee Waivers Duration:
 - (1) Up to four years.
 - (2) From September 1 of the enrolled academic year to August 31 of the following year. However, the end date of the scholarship is June 30th for graduating students.
 - (3) If a recipient's school enrollment is suspected or withdrawn, then he/she will no longer

qualify for the scholarship and will no longer receive the monthly stipend. If the 15th of the current month has already passed, the student may retain the grant for the current month.

- (4) If a recipient loses the academic year's enrollment qualification through incomplete registration, suspension, withdrawal, or transfer, then his/her scholarship qualification will be cancelled without deferment. The student shall repay the prorated amount of tuition and miscellaneous fees for the semester before officially leaving the University.

7. Issuance Method:

In accordance with the annual announcement posted by the Office of International Affairs.

8. Renewal Qualification:

- (1) Scholarship recipients must have a total average grade of 70.05 points (GPA of 2.44) or more for the previous academic year and no disciplinary record. If the student becomes an exchange student during the academic year, the foreign credits and grades earned during the exchange period shall be recognized by the department in which the student is enrolled.
- (2) Students who have not met the criteria of the preceding paragraph in the previous academic year will not be eligible to receive this scholarship for that academic year. However, if said students meet the criteria in the subsequent academic year, then they may reapply for the scholarship.

9. Scholarship recipients are not eligible to receive other scholarships offered by the University and the government. However, recipients of these scholarships may be eligible to apply for non-monthly payment scholarships.
10. Any unresolved issues will be addressed in accordance with the relevant regulations of the University.
11. Upon the approval of the President, these guidelines shall be implemented and the same shall apply to any amendment.

Note: In the event of discrepancies between the Chinese version and the English version of these Guidelines, the Chinese version shall prevail.
