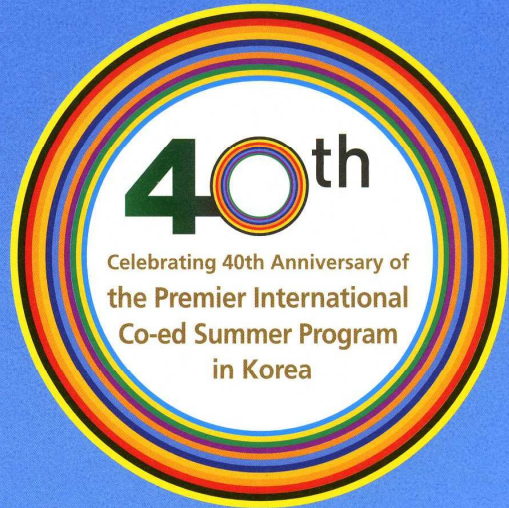

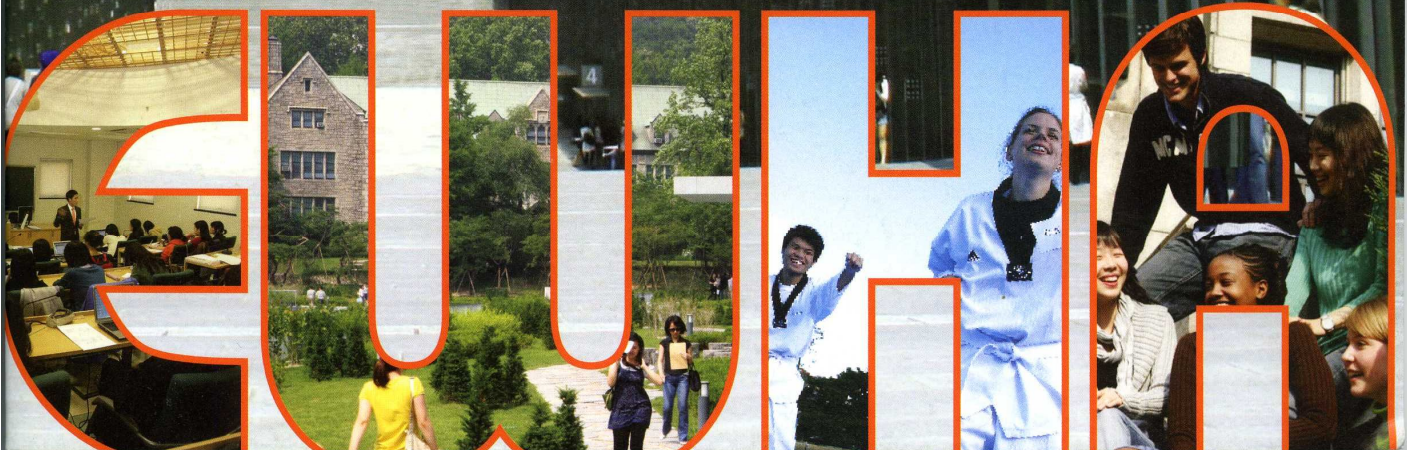

### Celebrating 40 years of Academic Excellence: Ewha International Summer College, 1971-2010

Four decades have passed since Ewha started the first-ever international summer program in a Korean institution, in 1971. It became the incubator for the 1st Joint Summer Curriculum between Ewha and the University of Kansas, "Kansas at Ewha Program."

Based on cumulative know-how and continuous devotion by the Summer Committee members, after nearly four decades, the magnitude of the program and variety of students have increased to another level.

Astounding for its diverse academic programs, Ewha is the place to be for future global leaders. Its 124 years of tradition as the pioneer of education culminated in KCUE (Korea Council for University Education)'s confirmation that it is the top institute of higher learning in the country. # Session

June 23<sup>rd</sup> - July 20<sup>th</sup>, 2010

Session I is a full month-long program designed for global talents with passion for both academic and cultural spheres. Academically, Ewha summer program is best known for professors with true dedication to their subjects with high expectations and who gladly engage with their students. ## ACADEMICS

Session II, "2010 Introductory Korean Studies", is a customized program to best provide students a chance to learn and experience Korea to the fullest. Students who register for Session II will automatically participate in the set academic program as below and participate in field trips and cultural excursions to places that best offer the traditional and contemporary culture of Seoul. On the first weekend during the 'Orientation Trip,' all participants will be able to truly experience and live authentic Korean culture in Jeonju City, with various hands-on experiences such as building a simple traditional Korean house called 'Hanok,' learning the traditional mask dance 'Talchoom,' making beautiful art work by using traditional Korean paper 'Hanji' and enjoy the scenic wonders at the world-renowned foreshores of the west coast. For the experience of modern Korea, there are visits to major TV broadcasting company, 'B-boy' performance, watching Korean movies together, just to name a few! Upon completion, all Session II participants will earn 3 credits.

 Traditional mask dance experience / Traditional Korean marriage experience / Traditional music experience

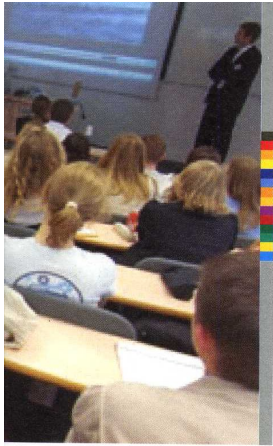

# Scholarship

## SCHOLARSHIPS

### Eligibility

Scholarships are open to Session I participants only.

### EISC Excellence Award:

Full tuition and application support to 2 students

Students enrolling in the Ewha International Summer College are eligible to apply for an EISC Tuition Scholarship, provided that their grade point average is a B or above.

### Gloria Hahn Memorial Scholarship:

Full tuition and application support to 1 student

Dr. Richard Hahn established this memorial scholarship for his wife, Kim Ronyoung (Mrs. Gloria Hahn) in 1988. Mrs. Hahn is the author of "Clay Walls", the first novel written by a Korean-American. This novel is about the first and second generation Korean immigrants to the United States during the early 20th century.

### Ewha Womans University Alumnae Association of Greater Washington, Inc. Scholarship:

Full tuition and application support to 2 students

Ewha Womans University Alumnae Association of Greater Washington, Inc. is one of the most extensive Ewha alumni network in the world. The Ewha Womans University Alumnae Association of Greater Washington, Inc. Scholarship assists overseas students - both foreign nationals and Korean nationals for their participation in the Ewha Summer Program. Any student currently residing in the United States of America is encouraged to apply for the program.

### Korea Adoptee Fellowship at Ewha (KAFF):

Full tuition and application support to 2 students

The Korean Adoptee Fellowship at Ewha (KAFF) assists overseas Korean adopted students in acquiring an understanding of their motherland through academic study and cross-cultural experiences. Korean adoptee students planning to enroll for Ewha International Summer College are eligible to apply.

### Ewha Alumnae Scholarship:

200,000 KRW tuition support to 10 students

## INTERNSHIPS

### Eligibility

2010 Ewha International Summer College Session I participants.

The Internship Program is designed to help students gain valuable tailor-made career experience relevant to their academic and career goals. Moreover, students will learn more about Korea and Korean culture during their hands-on training.

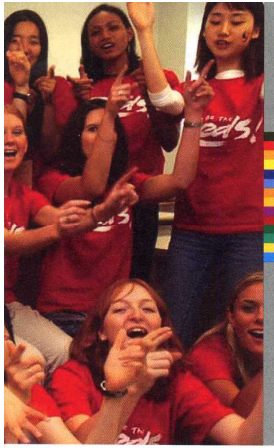
Upon submitting the 'Application form' and 'Resume', based on the student's job preference and request, the Ewha International Summer College shall try best to provide an internship position matching the individual's needs. Kindly note that due to limitations of internship spots, internship positions may not be available to some applicants. When we secure a company / institution who are looking for the qualifications of the applicant & which matches the internship applicant's needs, the applicant will be notified individually by email only.

The company / organization / institutions have the final say in the selection of students for the internship.

Please keep in mind that due to the limitations of student visas, these internships will not be remunerated. The internships will be for approximately 1 month after the summer program- the specifics are negotiable with the hosting company.

Also, students are welcome to stay on the on-campus dormitory if they participate in the internship programs. However, kindly note that the students themselves will be liable to pay for the additional dorm-fees.

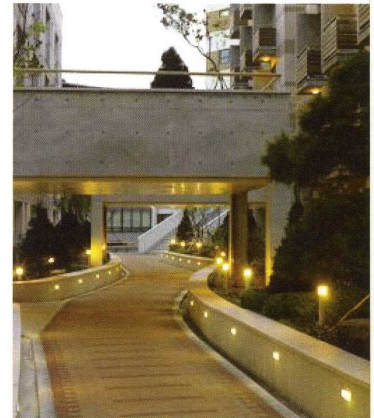
## ACCOMMODATION

### On-Campus Housing

The International House (I-House) dorm and Graduate Student dorm are on-campus housings located very near the EISC office which is located at B334 inside the ECC (Ewha Campus Complex). This state-of-the-art housing facility for students from overseas institution offers double and single rooms on a first-come-first-serve basis.

Since the I-House and Graduate dorm are always on high demand by international students, securing a room should be one of the first steps to take when applying for the 2010 Ewha International Summer College.

Note that the on-campus dorms are divided by unisex floors and every student should maintain respectable decorum.

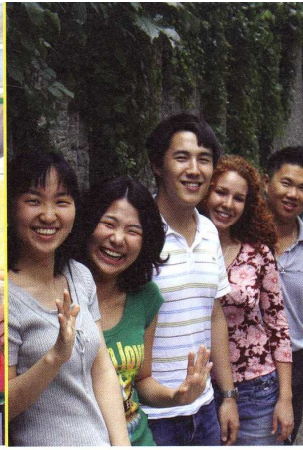

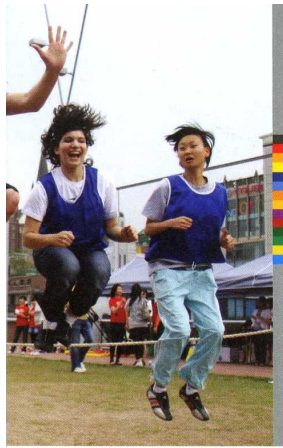

# Application

## HOW TO APPLY

The program welcomes undergraduate and graduate students, and those who wish to discover Korea through concentrated academic studies and diverse cross-cultural experiences. The summer program community consists of foreign nationals, second-generation expats, foreign residents currently residing in Korea, and Ewha undergraduate students. Please carefully read the following and submit relevant documents in order to be apply for the program. Application form can be accepted only through online application. All of the following must be received by May 20th (Thurs), 2010 for Session I and July 9th (Fri), 2010 for Session II.

### Application

#### 1 Eligibility

Current undergraduate and graduate school students.

**Note:** Those who are expected to go onto the undergraduate level in 2010 are also qualified to apply. Please note that all positions/availabilities are reserved on a first come first serve basis.

#### 2 Application Materials

Applications are open on-line only. Please check following link ([http://was1.ewha.ac.kr:8320/epas/epas\\_tsd/](http://was1.ewha.ac.kr:8320/epas/epas_tsd/)) or summer website for direct link. When applying on-line, students must prepare the below materials:

- Face picture (3cm×4 cm) in jpg file
- Copy of passport
- Copy of College / University Enrollment\*
- Copy of Overseas Traveler's Health Insurance\*\*

\* A proof of college enrollment that can confirm the student's university / college attendance, or proof of admission to university / college 2010 fall.

\*\* A copy of Overseas Traveler's Health Insurance which will cover for any incidents / medical emergencies that might occur during the student's stay in Korea for 2010 Ewha International Summer College participation.

#### 3 Visa

Please visit the nearest South Korean embassy or consul in your home country for accurate information. Take note that foreign nationals who participate in a short study abroad program such as the International Summer College program in Korea can only stay for a maximum of 90 days without visa.
